

Most low-income community college students can now receive SNAP benefits (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program | Food Stamps). SNAP provides benefits to help you buy food at grocery stores.

Prior to January 2018, students had to be working 20 hours per week, participating as a work-study, have young children, or have health problems to get SNAP. Now, Pennsylvania's community college students enrolled in programs that will improve their employability can also qualify for SNAP.
